Students attending summer programs as part of their graduate education may also apply. The maximum loan amount for a year of academic study or research is \$7000 and for a summer program is \$2000.

Training Program: If funds are available, The NAF will consider requests from individuals who are enrolled in a course, or courses, with the intent of developing a skill or specific technical expertise. The course of study must culminate with the award of a diploma or certificate. The maximum loan amount for a year of advanced training is \$3000.
