Former community member and SEA Semester Alumna Naomi Darling is returning to Woods Hole to share a bit about community and sustainability.

A Principal at Darling Loeffler-Puurunen Architecture, Darling aims to produce socially responsible and environmentally conscious projects at all scales in terms of size, time, and permanence. The firm continuously seeks to engage a creative investigative design process with a commitment to holistic sustainability considering site and place. Projects have ranged from playful installations to thoughtful urban master planning.

In her lecture, **Zoom: Scales of Sustainability**, Darling implores us to examine the concept of sustainability at different scales through space and time.



In addition to her design practice, Darling is an adjunct professor at the Yale School of Architecture where she teaches courses in sustainability and at Brown University in the Urban Studies Dept. where she co-teaches a seminar entitled "Green Cities". Darling's teaching and research has focused on interdisciplinary collaboration with scientists and ecologists in developing sustainable urban design proposals.

Darling is a recent recipient of a Hines Sustainability Grant. It was awarded to develop a sustainable framework for an urban design studio in Beijing, China offered at the Yale School of Architecture.
