# ATL 8.4 R/V Atlantis Port Watchstanding Procedures

### 1. Purpose

The purpose of this procedure is to set forth the standards for Port Watch Procedures aboard R/V Atlantis.

## 2. Responsibility

Deck Port Watches consist of an Officer of the Watch and a seaman at the gangway. The Engineering Department will stand watch in accordance with the "R/V Atlantis Engineering Department Standard Operating Policies and Procedures".

The Ship Operations Manager will assume responsibility for the vessel during lay-up periods or maintenance periods if the budget does not include funding for shipboard security. In this case, electronics and other measures will be used to replace the watchstanders.

#### 3. General

Port watches are stood in all ports from 1600 until 0800, seven days a week. At other times, port watches may be stood as deemed necessary. Watches may be modified due to special circumstances on a case-by-case basis. Port watches are not normally stood while Atlantis is in Woods Hole. MA.

R/V Atlantis maintains a Gangway Book that is kept in the vicinity of the ship's gangway. The Chief Mate keeps this book up-to-date. The Officer on Watch and the seaman at the gangway shall be familiar with all the latest information in the Gangway Book that includes:

- A. Port watch schedule, both Deck and Engine Departments
- B. What might be expected during the port call
- C. Arriving and departing Crew
- D. Agent information
- E. Tide Information
- F. Information on what to expect during the upcoming cruise
- G. Information regarding the loading of stores, science gear, fueling, etc.
- H. Local information that may be useful, including emergency phone numbers, hospitals, taxis, areas in town to avoid, local health concerns.

### Standing orders for Day Workers and Gangway Watch

- 1. Show up for work/watch on time, rested and alert.
- 2. Be aware of the times of High and Low Tides and maximum currents as posted.
- 3. Tend the gangway and mooring lines as necessary.
- 4. Do not leave the gangway unattended for any length of time.
- 5. No unauthorized or unescorted guests or visitors.
- 6. Ensure Deck lights are on at dusk and off at dawn.
- 7. If you are uncertain or need assistance, call the Mate on Watch.
- 8. No unauthorized watch changes. Check with the Chief Mate or the Mate on Watch.
- 9. No unauthorized overtime work. Only the Chief Mate or Master can authorize overtime.
- 10. Your first priority is Atlantis. Be attentive.
