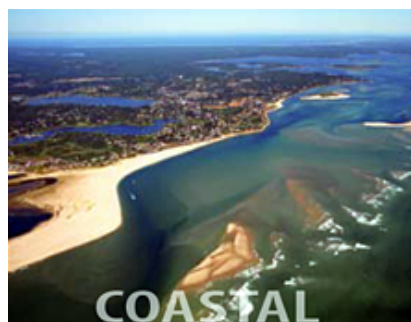
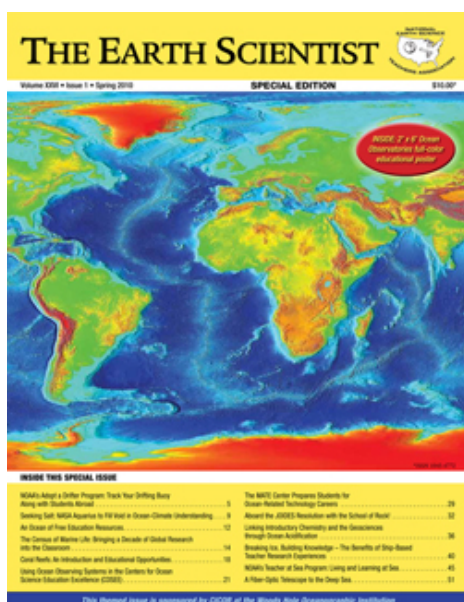


CICOR: Cooperative Institute for Climate and Ocean Research (CICOR)
