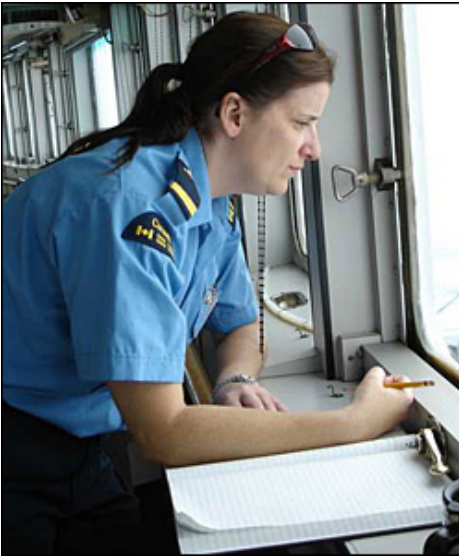


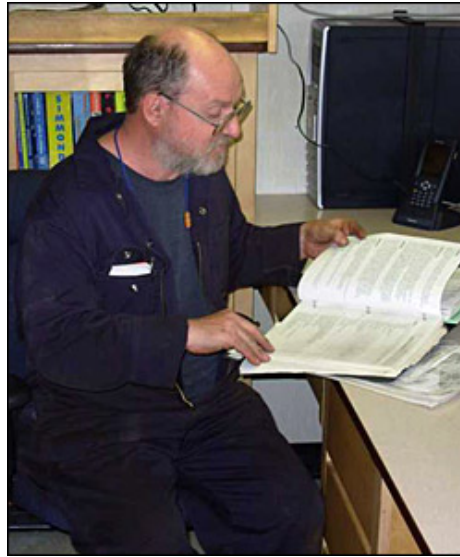
Beaufort Gyre Exploration Project: Dispatch 19: Faces of the Louis III
