

## Beaufort Gyre Exploration Project: Dispatch 26: Faces of the Louis IV

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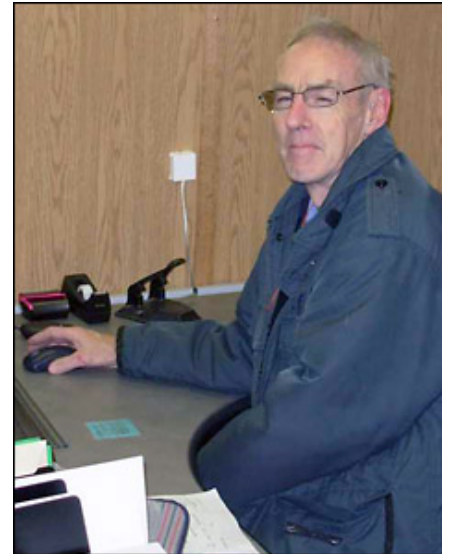
