

## International Committee: English Assistance

The tutoring program offered by the International Committee is ready to assist you in practicing and improving your English-speaking skills. The group of tutors are WHOI employees. Remember, they are not professionally trained teachers. Work schedules may not allow for all tutors to be available, but the coordinator of this program will make every effort to match a student with a tutor.

The program is very informal. The first meeting between you and the tutor will be arranged through the program coordinator, who will be present at this meeting. Each person's English skills are different, but it is recommended that you meet at least once a week as agreed upon between you and the tutor. All details about time, place of meeting, and how often are between you and the tutor.

There is no formal class structure. You and your tutor can decide what to do, the type of assistance you need. It is fun to discover interesting ways that will expand your vocabulary and speaking skills. You may also ask your tutor to help with your writing skills, to proofread papers, or critique a presentation.

### Free English Classes in Falmouth

This class is run by volunteer teachers, and it also has three levels of classes. The students are mostly adults and are from diverse backgrounds. Classes are scheduled on Wednesday and Thursday evenings 6:30 - 8:00. The school year is from September to April. The classes are small - no more than 12 students in a class. A personal appointment is not needed, and the student will be assessed and assigned to an appropriate group.

### Cape Cod Literacy Council

Cape Cod Literacy Council offers 'one-on-one' (private) tutoring instruction. Classes are free and scheduled by arrangement with a tutor once a week. They are held at a location outside the home that is convenient for the student and the tutor. All levels of English skills can be accommodated in this type of program.

### ESL (English as Second Language) Program

This is sponsored by the State of Massachusetts with ESL licensed instructors. There is a formal curriculum and three levels of classes are offered: Beginner, Intermediate and Advanced. These classes are held in the **evenings** at two locations: Mashpee High School, on Route 151 (town closest to Woods Hole and Falmouth) and Cape Cod Community College, in Hyannis, which is approximately a 45-minute ride from Woods Hole. For both locations you will need car transportation. The school year begins in September and ends in April. To register for these classes one must make an appointment. A prospective student is assessed and the appropriate class is decided. A teacher can decide to allow a student to join classes at any time, if the class is not full. Please note: Beginner level ESL classes have large numbers of applicants and there is often a waiting list.
