

Summary of Massachusetts Legislation


Municipalities and School Districts may now implement an ESPC through either:

Chapter 25A, Section 11C RFP process (1998)

or

Chapter 25A, Section 11I RFQ process (2006)

- Energy Management System
- Cogeneration

Six Key Steps

- 1) Organize and Mobilize
- 2) Select a Qualified Energy Services Provider
- Facilitate & Evaluate the Detailed Energy Audit
- 4) Negotiate the Performance Contract
- Support the Installation of the Energy Conservation Measures
- 6) Verify and Publicize Results Each Year



Potential Cost Buydowns

ESCo will seek out all available financial rebates and incentives on behalf of the customer

- Electric and Gas utility company conservation programs
- Massachusetts Technology Collaborative
 - Massachusetts Renewable Energy Trust
- **♣** Emission Credits US EPA and Mass DEP
 - New efficient equipment reduces power plant emissions
 - Clean Air Act provides economic incentives



Contractor Certification

- Contractors shall be certified by DCAM under Energy Management Services category
- Update Statements must be issued with proposals (reflect firm's experience, finances & current work)



Further Steps Necessary for Project Development

- File RFP with DOER at least one week prior to advertisement
- Advertise Project
 - Central Register, major and local newspapers
 Consider posting on Comm-Pass.com or
 City/Agency website
- Distribute RFP to all requesting parties
