Maybe Not What You Think

The Portuguese man-of-war (*Physalia physalis*) is infamous for its painful stinging tentacles that can extend up to 10 meters (33 feet) long down from the surface. They are used to catch small fish, usually at night. The man-of-war may look like a jellyfish, but it's actually a siphonophore. An "individual" is made up of genetically identical, but highly specialized, units called zooids: its gas-filled bladder, its tentacles, its digestive units, and its reproductive structures. Although man-of-wars are occasional visitors to Cape Cod, Mass., they are usually found in warmer coastal areas.
