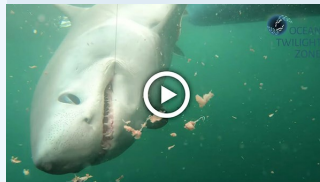


The ocean twilight zone's critical carbon pump
