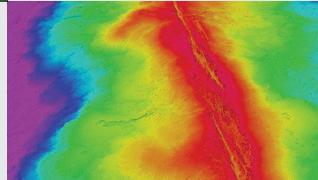


Image of the week: "Testing Mesobot in Bermuda"
