Increase their scientific knowledge and skills
Get them to focus on their academic career and future promotion
Become a local and national leader in their field
Submit strong, competitive grants
Complete their research in a timely manner
Complete joint manuscripts when due
Manage their research team
Serve as a strong role model for students in the group
Respond in a timely fashion to emails
Be on time for meetings
